**Annual Events.** With the Archeological Society of Maryland, Inc. (ASM) ([www.MarylandArcheology.org](http://www.MarylandArcheology.org)) we co-sponsor a number of events each year that are specifically oriented toward involving the public in archeology. Among these are the *Workshop in Archeology*, a day-long program on a Saturday in March with both interesting speakers and a variety of hands-on activities, and the *Annual Field Session in Maryland Archeology*, an 11-day field investigation



usually held in May at an important Maryland archeology site. Finally, *Maryland Archeology Month* is

celebrated each April and offers opportunities for you to learn of the programs and activities offered by others and by us.

**On-going Programs.** The Office of Archeology hosts an *Open Lab* on most Tuesdays during the year. Interested individuals can come to Crownsville and

learn proper techniques for cleaning, labeling, cataloging and storing archeological collections. Please contact the Office to confirm availability of this opportunity prior to making your plans.



**Special Opportunities.** The Office works with the ASM to offer *Sunday Survey* opportunities, generally on

Sundays each Spring and each Fall. These are full day field experiences that introduce participants to the techniques used by archeologists to identify sites.
