Nomination Instructions

The Patricia Seitz Teacher of the Year Award will be presented in April, 2007. This presentation will be part of the Maryland Archeology Month activities. Nomination Requirements follow:

Eligibility: Open to all public, parochial and independent school teachers, grades K-12, in the state of Maryland.

Inclusions: All of the following items must be submitted in order to be considered:

Completed 2005-2006 Nomination Form

Letter of nomination by a professional educator in the school or school system in which the nominee is employed.

Abstract of no more than 100 words describing the project, activities, or instruction attributed to the nominee. this should include information about the grade level(s) and type of class / classes the nominee teaches and any innovations, or unique aspects introduced or created by the nominee.

Brief description of the program to include:

Relevance to the curriculum

Objectives, concepts, and issues addressed

Evaluative measures

Assessment of effectiveness in terms of student achievement

Other supporting documents which may be submitted are:

Letters of support from faculty, students, parents or other non-school personnel but which are specific to the archeological aspects of the nominee's achievements (limit 3)

Examples of student work (limit 3)

Examples of lesson plans or activities (limit 3)

All supporting documents or evidence of student work should be submitted on 8 1/2 X 11 paper. Photographic evidence may be substituted for oversize, bulky materials or evidence of student participation.

Date Due: All material MUST be received no later than Monday, July 31, 2006 unless other arrangements have been made.

Submission: Submit ALL of the above materials to the ASM, Inc. Award Program coordinator listed on the nomination form.

Announcement: The winner will be notified by March 31, 2007.

Award: A Certificate of Achievement and check for \$100 will be awarded at a ceremony held in Annapolis during Maryland Archeology Month, April, 2007. The exact date will be announced later.
